



RAMS HOLD 12 PICKS IN 2014 NFL DRAFT

St. Louis To Pick 2nd & 13th In First Round



NFL DRAFT SET FOR MAY 8-10

For the fifth-consecutive year, the NFL draft will kickoff in prime-time and take place over the course of three days. The first round begins at 7 p.m. CT on Thurs., May 8. The second and third rounds will be held on Fri., May 9 starting at 6 p.m. CT, and the draft will conclude with rounds 4-7 on Sat., May 10 beginning at 11 a.m. CT. For the ninth-straight year, the NFL Draft will be held at Radio City Music Hall in New York City.

There will be 256 selections over the draft's seven rounds, including 32 compensatory selections that have been awarded to 13 teams that suffered a net loss of certain quality unrestricted free agents last year. The Rams hold a total of 12 selections.

Teams will have 10 minutes to make selections in the first round and seven minutes to make selections in the second round. In rounds three through seven, teams will be allotted five minutes per selection.

2013 NFL DRAFT COVERAGE

The **NFL Network** and **ESPN/ESPN 2** will televise the draft on all three days. ESPN's Josina Anderson will be on hand at Rams Park reporting throughout the draft, and NFL Network's **NFL AM** will air from Rams Park on Thursday.

Fans can also follow the draft online. **StLouisRams.com**, the official website of the St. Louis Rams,

NFL.com, the league's official website, will stream video of NFL Network's draft coverage and NFL.com/LIVE and will provide a "Draft Tracker" with real-time selection information as well as exclusive pick-by-pick analysis from NFL.com's experts.



RAMS ROUND-BY-ROUND SELECTIONS

The Rams hold 12 selections in the 2014 Draft. General Manager Les Snead and his staff will make the second and 13th overall selections in the first round. St. Louis is scheduled to make one pick each in rounds two through five. The Rams were awarded a compensatory selection in round six and two in round seven. The Rams also own an extra seventh round pick thanks to a 2012 trade that sent CB Josh Gordy to Indianapolis.

St. Louis finished the 2013 season with a 7-9 record and were awarded the 13th selection in the 2014 Draft. St. Louis received the 2nd overall pick in a 2012 trade with Washington. The Redskins received the second overall pick in the 2012 Draft from the Rams, which Washington used to select QB Robert Griffin, III.

RAMS PICKING NO. 2 & 13

The Rams have executed the second overall pick seven times, and while every draft can have its share of hits and misses, the no. 2 spot has been an overwhelmingly good one for the franchise.

Twice, the Rams have selected at Hall of Famer with the second pick. In 1966, the team used the selection on C **Tom Mack**, who never missed a game in his 13-year career. Mack went to 11 Pro Bowls and was a five-time All-Pro.

In 1983, the Rams did it again. Immediately after Baltimore drafted John Elway with the top pick, the Rams selected **Eric Dickerson**. As a rookie, Dickerson rushed for 1,808 yards, a number that still stands as most among NFL rookies. He also owns the single-season record with 2,105 yards.

The second overall selection has also netted the Rams RB **Dick Bass**, who was the franchise's all-time leading rusher when he retired in 1969 and still ranks fifth. QB **Roman Gabriel**, a three-time Pro Bowler and 1969 NFL MVP, came to the Rams via the second pick in 1962, and DE **Chris Long** (50.5 career sacks) was the second pick in 2008.

The Rams have only executed the 13th pick once. That came in 2007 when they chose DL **Adam Carriker**, who played two seasons with the team before he was traded to Washington.

DOUBLING UP

The Rams are one of two teams that currently hold two first round picks in this year's draft. The Rams will select 13th based on their 2012 finish, and they'll select 2nd thanks to a 2012 trade with the Washington Redskins. Cleveland is the other team with two picks in Round 1. They own the Colts' top selection as a result of a trade involving RB Trent Richardson.

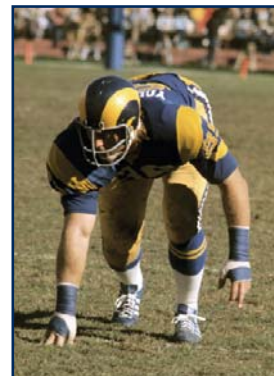
In the last 10 years, 34 teams have held more than one pick in the first round. In 2012, two teams - Minnesota and St. Louis - had multiple first-round picks.

Last season, the Rams selected Tavon Austin and Alec Ogletree in the first round.

The last time they made multiple first-round picks in consecutive years was 1988 and '89.

Since the AFL-NFL merger in 1969, the Rams have made multiple first round picks in the same draft on eight occasions. They've done so three times since moving to St. Louis - 2001, 1996 (RB Lawrence Phillips and WR Eddie Kennison) and 2013.

Perhaps the most successful first round in team history came in 1971, when the Rams selected LB Isaiah Robertson with the 10th selection and DE Jack Youngblood 20th. Robertson went to six Pro Bowls with the Rams, while Youngblood was named to seven Pro Bowls and was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2001.



The Rams had one of the most successful first rounds in team history in 1971 when they selected Jack Youngblood (pictured) and Isaiah Robertson
